Experience in arbitration

Since 2009 Alba Briones has been working in a team with Juan Fernández-Armesto, founding partner of Armesto & Asociados, in more than 10 arbitration proceedings, including domestic and international, *ad-hoc* and administrative arbitrations and involving commercial, as well as construction and investment disputes.

Most of the international commercial cases were administered by the ICC, whilst other arbitrations were conducted under the rules of the LCIA. As regards international commercial *ad-hoc* arbitrations, most of them were subject to the UNCITRAL Rules. Alba Briones has acted as Secretary to the Arbitral Tribunal.

Her experience in domestic commercial arbitration relates to cases administered by the Madrid Court of Arbitration. Alba Briones has also participated in domestic commercial *ad-hoc* cases subject only to the Spanish Arbitration Act.

Investment disputes were administered by ICSID.
